The Early Years Check-In (EYCI)

A free, simple and convenient tool to quickly identify any concerns you may have about your child's development.

What is the EYCI?

As parents and caregivers, you know your child best and play a key role in supporting their early development. The EYCI is made up of 11 questions to help you identify any concerns you may have about your child's development in the areas of language, movement, thinking and learning, and social and emotional skills.

Available online or on paper, it can be completed for children 18 months to 6 years of age and takes only a few minutes to complete.

How do I complete the EYCI?

Use the simple blue scale to mark your level of concern from 'no concerns' to 'very concerned' for each question. Based on your responses to all the items, you will receive an overall result of low, elevated or high concern.

When using the online version, you can choose to email, print or download your results for future reference. You will also receive a personalized activity list from Play&Learn based on your results. You can use this immediatly to help improve your child's skills in the areas you may have concerns about.

Next Steps?


Whether you complete the EYCI online or on paper, share your results with an early years professional so that you can discuss possible next steps and available resources to support your child's development.
